
Diocese of the Central Gulf Coast Cycle of Prayer for Prisons, Prisoners, Staff, Their Families and the Victims of Crime Everywhere

Welcome! God be with you and all who pray! This booklet is a result of the work and ministry of the Commission on Prison Ministry in the Diocese of the Central Gulf Coast. It is hoped that it will provide a way into prison ministry for those who would like to heed the words of Jesus in Matthew 25:34-40: Then the king will say to those at his right hand, 'Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me.' Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?' And the king will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me.'

It seems very clear to us, from the words in Matthew's Gospel, that prison ministry is an important part of the Kingdom of Heaven's drawing near and that all of us, as Baptized members of the Body of Christ, are called to that ministry. Unfortunately, not all of us are able to visit prisons ourselves because of various reasons, but all of us can PRAY and this booklet is designed to help in that effort. Please incorporate these prayers and intentions into your parish's Prayers of the People during worship and in your own daily prayers as well. We have included several prayers in an effort to keep this effort always fresh but please feel free to write your own prayers as well and we hope that you will share them with us.

We have attempted to include all major incarceration facilities in our diocese but it is possible that we have omitted some either in error or in ignorance. If we have, we ask your forgiveness in advance and we hope that you and your church will be able to use this prayer plan as your entry into ministry to those who have been shut away and those who watch them and the families of all involved.

A Daily Prayer for Justice and Mercy

Lord Jesus, for our sake you were condemned as a criminal: Visit our jails and prisons with your pity and judgment. Remember all prisoners, and bring the guilty to repentance and amendment of life according to your will, and give them hope for their future. When any are held unjustly, bring them release; forgive us, and teach us to improve our justice.

Remember those who work in these institutions; keep them humane and compassionate; and save them from becoming brutal or callous. And since what we do for those in prison,

O Lord, we do for you, constrain us to improve their lot. All this we ask for your mercy's sake. *Amen*.

Let us pray for all who suffer and are afflicted in body or in mind; For the hungry and the homeless, the destitute and the oppressed For the sick, the wounded, and the crippled For those in loneliness, fear, and anguish For those who face temptation, doubt, and despair

For the sorrowful and bereaved

For prisoners and captives, and those in mortal danger That God in his mercy will comfort and relieve them, and grant them the knowledge of his love, and stir up in us the will and patience to minister to their needs.

Silence

Gracious God, the comfort of all who sorrow, the strength of all who suffer: Let the cry of those in misery and need come to you, that they may find your mercy present with them in all their afflictions; and give us, we pray, the strength to serve them for the sake of him who suffered for us, your Son Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*.

Loving God, your Son knew what it is like to be a prisoner. Help us to remember those in prison, for whatever reason, Without judging and without condemning, believing that no-one is beyond your grace and forgiveness. We ask this is in the Name of Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*.
